

Community Feedback Report

We asked our community: what are you most interested in?



Over half of respondents indicated they are also interested in **environmental and clean air issues** and **asthma research and clinical studies.**

We asked: which of our programs and services have you/your family found helpful?

The majority shared that they find **our website our most helpful resource**, followed by educational webinars and digital publications.



69% said they found *asthma.ca* helpful.

We asked: what would you like to see more of from Asthma Canada?

Community members specified they would like to see more education about:

- Genetic factors that may exacerbate symptoms
- Research developments and breakthrough achievements in treatment options
- Medication options
- Community awareness and employer education
- Booklets about asthma/asthma attacks/how to cope with asthma
- The role of asthma educators
